The Life & Legacy of William Payne Stewart

is an iconic figure in the world of professional golf. His unique style, both on and off the golf course, set him apart as one of the most recognizable and beloved personalities in the sport. Known for his distinctive clothing, which included knickers and a tam-o'-shanter hat, Stewart brought a sense of fashion and flair to the game that few others could match. His unique style, sportsmanship, and continuing legacy make him one of golf's most enduring icons both with golfers and non-golfers alike. "A legend is someone who leaves behind an unforgettable impression on others. They touch lives, they're remembered, they're cherished." We celebrate the life and legacy of this iconic legend.

William Payne Stewart was born in Springfield, MO on January 30, 1957, and first stepped onto a golf course at Hickory Hills Country Club at the age of 3. Payne's mother Bee and his father Bill taught Payne the importance of practicing the game that eventually lifted him to an iconic and legendary status. Stewart attended Greenwood High School from 1971-75 and led his team to the Missouri State Championship. He attended Southern Methodist University in Dallas, TX where he was a member of Phi Gamma Delta and an All-American golfer. He was the SWC individual cochampion along with Houston's Fred Couples in 1979. For all Payne's acclaim and status as a player Chuck Cook, Payne's long-time instructor said about him "he was a Missouri mule. Just a country boy from Springfield."

In 1979, Stewart turned professional upon graduation from SMU (Business Major) but failed PGA Qualifying School that year, so he competed on the Asian Tour before earning his PGA Tour card in 1981.

Stewart met Tracey Ferguson, sister of Australian golfer Mike Ferguson, in Kuala Lumpur in 1980 while he was playing on the Asia Golf Circuit, and they were married by November 1982. Payne and Tracey have two children Chelsea and Aaron.

Stewart was also a musician and played harmonica in the blues rock group Jake Trout and the Flounders, which also included fellow golfers Larry Rinker and Peter Jacobsen. The band released one album; I Love to Play in 1998

Payne won a total of 23 professional golf tournaments and played on 14 USA National Teams including 5 U.S. Ryder Cup Teams (1987, 1989, 1991, 1993 and 1999).

Tragically, he died in a plane crash October 25, 1999.

On November 12, 2001, just two years after his passing, Payne Stewart was inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame. Stewart was also inducted into the PGA of America Hall of Fame in 2015. Stewart was inducted into the Texas Sports Hall of Fame in 2000.

He won over \$2 million during the 1999 season and finished seventh on the year's money list. In 1999 was 3rd on the All-time career earnings list.

At Pinehurst No. 2, a bronze statue of Stewart celebrating his winning putt in the 1999 U.S. Open ("One Moment In Time") there overlooks the 18th green.

Payne Stewart Award

In 2000, The PGA TOUR created the Payne Stewart Award given annually to a player sharing Payne's respect for the traditions of the game, his commitment to uphold the game's heritage of charitable support, and his professional and meticulous presentation of himself and the sport through his dress and conduct. A Deeper Understanding of the Man Payne Stewart

"People who knew Payne well recognized that he had changed somehow for the better. He possessed a deeper, unusual sense of peace... a peace that hadn't always been there." ~ Tracey Stewart

"Payne and I started reading devotionals together, But before long I noticed that he was much farther along than I was. He'd read the Scripture from the devotional every night before he went to bed. He also began reading the Bible. Nobody tried to talk Payne into what he should believe or how he should live out his faith; he simply set out on his own journey with God. The Scriptures themselves were the most powerful influence on Payne's life." ~ Tracey Stewart

"Payne was very much a 'Christian in process,' not someone who felt he had arrived spiritually. He never pretended to have the answers and probably didn't know what some of the questions were. But his faith was genuine, and as he understood the Bible, the issue wasn't about how much faith he had but whether his faith in Christ was real. And everyone close to Payne knew that his faith was real." ~ Tracey Stewart

"I'm not a 'Bible-thumper'--I can't get up there on a rock and tell you what it all means, because I don't know. But I'm learning, and I like what I'm learning." ~ Payne Stewart

"Payne Stewart has finished the race, he has kept the faith, and now the crown of righteousness is his. Payne Stewart loved life and loved people. During this past year, everyone who knew Payne Stewart saw a dramatic change in his life. They saw in Payne what the Bible calls a 'peace which passes all understanding. Only God can do that because only God can change a heart....

Whoever you are, wherever you are, whatever you have done, if you feel the tug of God's Spirit on your heart, do not turn away. If, like Payne, you want to know the happiness and peace that only Jesus Christ can bring, I invite you to confess your sins and receive him as your Savior. Regardless of what your life has brought you, His love is enough. And His peace is for real." ~ Paul Azinger's eulogy at Stewart's memorial service, broadcast live around the world.

"Then I heard [the distinct words of] a voice from heaven, saying, "Write, 'Blessed (happy, prosperous, to be admired) are the dead who die in the Lord from now on!'" "Yes, [blessed indeed]," says the Spirit, "so that they may rest and have relief from their labors, for their deeds do follow them." ~ Revelation 14:13 AMP [...Payne's legacy follows him]

"We are of good courage and confident hope and prefer rather to be absent from the body and to be at home with the Lord." 2 Corinthians 5:8 AMP [...No one ever dies, they just change residences]

"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ [that is, grafted in, joined to Him by faith in Him as Savior], he is a new creature [reborn and renewed by the Holy Spirit]; the old things [the previous moral and spiritual condition] have passed away. Behold, new things have come [because spiritual awakening brings a new life]." 2 Corinthians 5:17 AMP [...Payne did not lose his life, he just has a new life]

"Listen very carefully, I tell you a mystery [a secret truth decreed by God and previously hidden, but now revealed]; we will not all sleep [in death], but we will all be [completely] changed [wondrously

transformed], ⁵² in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at [the sound of] the last trumpet call. For a trumpet will sound, and the dead [who believed in Christ] will be raised imperishable, and WE [who are alive in Christ] will be [completely] changed [wondrously transformed]. ⁵³ For this perishable [part of us] must put on the imperishable [nature], and this mortal [part of us that is capable of dying] must put on immortality [which is freedom from death]. ⁵⁴ And when this perishable [body of those who died in Christ] puts on the imperishable, and this mortal [those who remain in Christ] puts on immortality, then the Scripture will be fulfilled that says, "Death is swallowed up in victory (vanquished forever)." 1 Corinthians 15:51-54 AMP [...Payne has just gone from the land of the dead to the land of the living ~ Azinger]
